Forklift License Prince Albert - In North America, acquiring forklift certification or a forklift license involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of provincial, federal and state groups. Operators could obtain a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements have to be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machinery which is designed along with numerous options, like sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and various types and sizes to meet the industrial needs of employees. Operator training programs are usually individualized to address the certain uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift inside a warehouse surroundings will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck within a shipyard. The different lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and industries. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to focus on specific course requirements but rather on the results of individual training programs.

On the job training that is provided by the employer is the most common method of forklift training licensing and certification. The employer who provides this method of certification is required to offer classroom sessions and practical training on machinery at their place of work. Employers may opt to train staff on each kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The program incorporates forklift operation methods, company rules, lift truck maintenance and safety procedures. Topics particular to the worksite, such as dangerous materials or conditions, must be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate each kind of lift truck on the worksite.

When using a third party trainer, the certification process will normally consist of an on-site component together with hands-on practice.

Usually, an employer-provided certification would not transfer from the current employer to the next employer. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training permits the operator to run a forklift for that specific employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an essential factor of the lift truck license training, even though the particulars of the safety training would be dependent upon the machinery being utilized. Some safety issues would vary for every employer and industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like in marine and offshore uses.
