Legislation provides rules for the safe inspection, maintenance and operation of lifting machinery all around North America. Crane Safety courses help owners and managers of cranes accredit their operators in accordance with provincial legislation.

Articulated cranes under 16,000 lbs. capacity can only be operated by accredited operators. Operators should be knowledgeable regarding the features and operational characteristics of the equipment. Prior to use, a pre-operational machine check should be performed. There is a legal requirement to perform a pre-operational inspection and a check of the overhead conditions and worksite ground.

The instructions provided in the manufacturer handbook gives information on inspection, maintenance, and loading and unloading operations. According to legislation, daily and annual checks are mandatory. Drivers must maintain an up-to-date logbook within nearly all regions. They may be needed to confirm equipment warranties.

It is suggested that businesses add remote control devices to their cranes. Remote control improves safety by allowing the operator an easier option for handling the crane.

Improving crane safety would normally help a company's bottom line. Those companies which follow safe machine practices would usually see greater cost savings compared to companies that don't. The chance of equipment damage and personal injury is greatly reduced if a well trained operator is handling the crane. Safety conscious drivers are more productive resulting in reduced times required for loading and unloading.
